Hi team! Dean here. I want to share something that happened to me last month and what I learned from it.

Mistakes Have Consequences

At 10:30 PM on 5 September I wrecked my van when I mistakenly turned into a ditch instead of merging onto an exit, careened across the exit into a second ditch, traveled about 50 meters along an embankment and came to an abrupt stop in a muddy ditch. The accident totally wrecked my van, but luckily, I walked away from the accident.

At least I did that night. Two days later the soreness and pain got to the point I sought medical attention ... and, after an MRI, learned that I had fractured my sternum and suffered a compression fracture of my L4 vertebrae. They'll heal by themselves over time but I'm sore and restricted from lifting anything heavier than about 10 pounds. And I'm not supposed to run. All told it will take 4-6 months to get back to normal.



Lessons Learned

So what did I do wrong? I lost situational awareness. I was too eager to get home from a long day. I had been on the road for 8 hours straight and I got distracted. I was driving alone, listening to the radio, and letting my mind wander on thoughts and new ideas I wanted to investigate. And I lost focus on where I was at that very moment when I needed to be paying attention. Several takeaways. Take time to rest on long trips. Nighttime driving is particularly challenging, so don't push your luck. And remove all distractions. Any distraction, especially under low light conditions can be disastrous. In this case, that's exactly what happened to me.

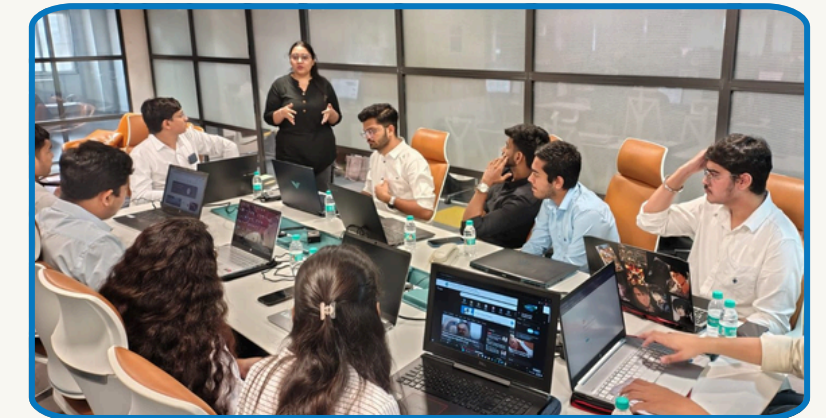


Update from India

2nd October (Thursday)

20th October (Monday)

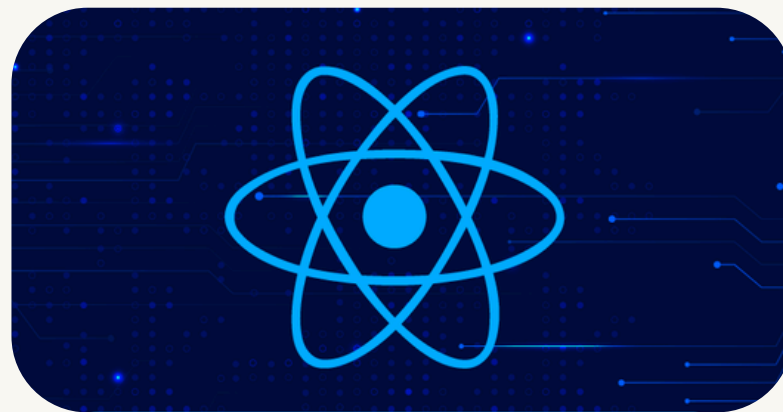

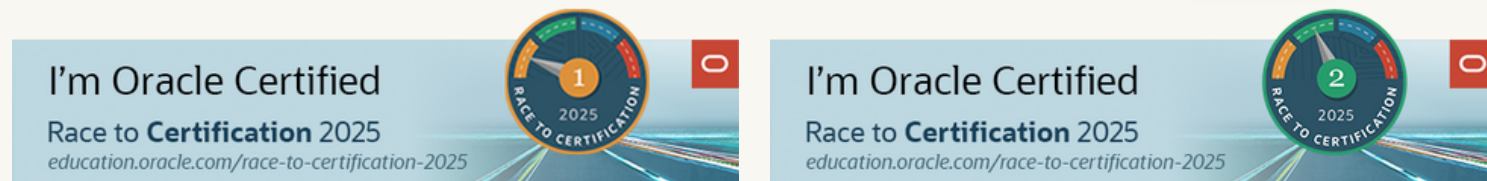
